The Freedoms of Women in Latin America (La Libertad de Las Mujeres en Latinoamérica)

Abstract

Women in Latin America have historically faced many difficulties. The novels of different Latin American authors, including Gabriel Garcia Marquez (Colombia, 1927) and Maria Luisa Bombal (Chile, 1910-1980), demonstrate that women do not have the same freedom as men, especially in the first decades of the twentieth century. As a result of this inequality, Latin American women do not have the same opportunities to do things such as working outside the house, receiving an education, or simply being independent from men in general. Although circumstances change with the times, putting an end to the vicious cycle of women's inequality is very difficult. The novels that are discussed in this paper symbolically address this inequality in South America that has been observed and studied by sociologists.
